Many world class cities, including San Francisco and many European cities, have addressed this problem by installing state of the art, self-cleaning toilets. These automated public toilets are self-cleaning and have security measures in the programming of the toilet operation to discourage illegal activity. In addition, these toilet structures can have associated newsracks and information panels tastefully incorporated and will beautify the streetscape. Furthermore, it is possible for the City to have such toilets installed and maintained at no annual cost with additional revenue to the City, in conjunction with kiosk advertising programs on some City sidewalks and rights of way.

City staff have made attempts to institute a pilot program for a limited number of automated toilets in certain areas of the City, but it appears that issuing a RFP for a citywide program would be in the City's best long term interests.

It is critical that the City move forward immediately to conduct a competitive process to select a contractor for the provision of this amenity in our City.
